

Director's Note

What A Gift And What A Blessing

Francesca's story is many things—the story of a war bride, an Italian girl who builds a farm and a life and a family in the lowa heartlands with her soldier from the States, the story of a grown woman who rediscovers the self she thought was subsumed in the details of running a household, and, above all, it is a love story.

Certainly it is a story of two people finding a wholly unexpected romantic love, swept away beyond reason, beyond the boundaries of time and place and expectations. But this story is, in many ways, a meditation on love, a joyous paean to all kinds of love: the struck-by-lightning, bolt-from-the-blue, finding-your-soulmate instant and compelling romantic attraction... love as a moment of grace, outside of time, that fuels a lifetime of duty... the kind of love that is built over decades, that expresses itself through daily acts of service and care and consideration... the love between parents and children... the artist's love for his or her vocation... and love that manifests as a tight-knit community pulling together to weather difficult circumstances. In the same way that joy is deeper and not always as easy as contentment, love is not always an easy emotion. Francesca's love certainly pushes her beyond the comfortable and carefully constructed path that she planned. Bridges of Madison County is a story of what happens when life takes a wholly unexpected turn, when we choose which doors to open, which roads to follow and which bridges to cross.

May your life be overflowing with love, and may love always light your path through the world.




The Cast
