

# Remembering Gary Lickfett

We at DLO Musical Theatre are heartbroken at the passing of Gary Lickfett. A longtime board member and six-term President, Gary was instrumental in setting DLO on the path that we are on today.

During Gary's service to the board, there wasn't a show he didn't either build the set for, or help in some way with the design. His ability to turn a director's dreams into a reality on stage were unparalleled, and his frugality with set construction costs was legendary.

Some of his more memorable creations include the sets for *The Great American Trailer Park Musical* (made partially from actual mobile homes), *Les Misérables, The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas* (so many doors, so many fans a turnin'!), *Cinderella, Working,* and *Beauty and the Beast.* Indeed, his impact on community theatre was much wider than just DLO, with Gary having worked with most, if not all, other local theatre organizations.

As President of the board, Gary led by example, encouraging discussion and debate while never forcing an agenda, handling compliments or complaints with the same grace that he dealt with everything else.

As a mentor and friend, Gary's kindness and patience helped many folks, particularly younger ones, through their first try at a paint brush, screw gun, or table saw. His guidance will reverberate through this organization for decades.


Though we miss him terribly, we are comforted by the fact that his kindness and example are still with us, illuminating the way to DLO's future. We extend our deepest sympathies to his family.


2006 Production of "Working"

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# Director's Note

### What makes a monster...what makes a man?

The journey began for me about seven years ago, when I stumbled across a terrific version of this musical - a musical I didn't even know existed at all - done by the La Jolla Playhouse. I was struck by its soaring, beautiful music and the way the musical was structured. They could have easily taken the Disney cartoon and moved it directly to the stage, but this ... this is the cartoon re-imagined for adults, the music expanded and writ large, the themes and characters fleshed out and given depth.

It has been extremely interesting to research this work and its changing meaning over time. Hugo's novel was originally written as a plea to save historic architecture, which in his time was under serious threat of demolition. Sound familiar? (Hint: Look up!) Various movies have put several slants on the work, and we arrive today at what I think to be a vehicle to give us the chance to think about inclusion and equality, the slippery slope of power, and the timelessness of love and friendship.



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
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# The Cast

## Notes on the Term "Gypsy" and the Romani People

The term "gypsy" is a pejorative to the Romani people. The original source material for the musical (the novel by Victor Hugo) is extremely racist. It perpetuates disgusting stereotypes and misinformation about Romani people as well as using slurs (especially in English translations). The novel was written in a time when that term was in the common vernacular, and we use it here in our production to stay in the context of that time in which the musical takes place.

At first the musical leans into those myths and prejudices surrounding the Romani people, and perhaps perpetuates them with depictions of casual thievery and magic. However, our Romani characters are allowed to hope for a time where things are different:



Will we reach a friendlier shore
Will we find a haven once more
Where we'll be in a place of miracles
Now we leave our home
For a place of miracles
Romanis again must roam
Could there be a country
Kinder to our race
In a place of miracles




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
