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SYNOPSIS OF SCENES

ACT 1

Toulon 1815—Jean Valjean is released from a long, unjust prison sentence, and finds life on an ex-convict's ticket-of leave very diffcult. The saintly Bishop of Digne turns Valjean from bitterness toward a new life.

"Prologue"	Prisoners, Valjean, Javert, Ensemble
"Who Am I"	Valjean

Montreuil 1823—After eight years under an assumed name, Valjean is a wealthy factory owner, and the mayor of Monreuil-sur-mer; he is universally respected as a kind and good man.

"At the End of the Day".....Ensemble, Valjean, Fantine Fantine loses her job at the factory when it is discovered she has a child. She sinks into abject poverty, despair and illness. Valjean discovers her plight and takes her into his care.

"The Confrontation"......Valjean, Javert Valjean finds Cosette, Fantine's daughter, and convinces her esrtwhile 'caretakers', the innkeepers Thénardier, to let him raise her.

"Castle on a Cloud"......Cosette, Mme. Thénardier "Master of the House"...... M. Thénardier Mme. Thénardier "The Bargain"......Cosette, Valjean, M. Thénardier Mme. Thénardier

Paris 1832—Nine years later, we learn of the plight of the poor from Gavroche, a street urchin, and find Valjean and the grown-up Cosette helping the poor.

"Look Down"......Gavroche, Marius, Enjolras, Ensemble We meet Marius, a student, and Éponine Thénardier, who is in love with Marius, although he is oblivious to her feelings. Marius sees Cosette, and falls in love. M. Thénardier recognizes Valjean as an ex-convict, and informs Javert, who vows to bring the fugitive to justice.

"Stars".....Javert At the café, the revolutionaries alternate between good-naturedly teasing Marius for having fallen in love, and discussing the rising discontent in Paris and the possibility of a mass uprising. They plan a demonstration to coincide with the funeral procession of beloved populist leader, General Lamarque.

Marius and Cosette lament their immanent parting. The revolutionaries plan the revolt.

Valjean and a badly wounded Marius are the only survivors of the battle. They escape into the sewers, where Valjean collapses in exhaustion. Thénardier robs Marius, thinking him dead.

"Empty Chairs at Empty Tables"......Marius Valjean confesses his past to Marius and plans to disappear for Cosette's safety. The Thénardiers attend Cosette and Marius's wedding, intending to blackmail Marius. They unwittingly reveal that it was Valjean who saved Marius at the barricades.

"Wedding Chorale/Beggars at the Feast"...Marius, Cosette, Ensemble Marius and Cosette find Valjean near death, and are reconciled with him as he finds peace at last.

"Do You Hear the People Sing" (Rep.)...Valjean, Marius, Cosette, Ensemble






