DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Meet Me in St. Louis holds a lot of special memories for my family. Her grandmother took my mother to see the movie in the theater when she was a young girl, and it was the first DLO musical my mother took me to see. The movie version is part of our Christmas tradition. Judy Garland singing "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" (captured by her future husband, Vincente Minnelli) is easily one of the most beautiful moments on film.

My love of the movie, visits to Forest Park in St. Louis (site of the World's Fair) and my natural curiosity led me to discover that the show is based on a book of the same name by Sally Benson, inspired by her own family's stories of 1903. (Tootie was based on herself.) In real life, the Benson family sadly made the dreaded move to New York. Even sadder, the grand Victorian house Benson's family grew up in (5135 Kensington Ave.) was dilapidated and torn down in 1994, and Ms. Benson has yet to be awarded a star on St. Louis' Walk of Fame. Happily, the Smith family story lives on, with its "wish fulfillment" ending. In 1989 the movie was transformed into a Broadway show, the final version of which we happily present to you tonight.

The world of 1903 is so very different from the world of 2018, though not necessarily simpler; imagine waiting for a long-distance phone call on a family's one landline phone and the cost involved! My cast, particularly the younger ones who have grown up in our modern era, vastly enjoyed this timeless show. On behalf of the cast and crew (which includes my mother as producer!), thank you for taking part in my family's holiday tradition.






