

THE BEST LITTLE MUSICAL YOU NEVER HEARD OF

Despite an award-winning off-Broadway premiere in 1997 followed by a critically acclaimed and awardwinning Broadway revival in 2014, you have probably never heard of the musical VIOLET.

Inspired by the short story "The Ugliest Pilgrim" written by Doris Bets, VIOLET tells the tale of a disfigured woman who travels across the country in Greyhound bus on a quest for healing. It is 1964, the beginning of the Civil Rights movement, and VIOLET explores the nature of beauty, love, and the meaning of true healing. It is a reminder that one should never "judge a book by its cover," whether that "cover" is disfigurement or the color of one's skin or the depth of one's faith.

I fell in love with VIOLET in 2010 after listening to the score. This is not a traditional musical. The score, with music by Jeanine Tesori (*Shrek the Musical, Fun Home*) and book/lyrics by Brian Crawley, ranges from country to Memphis R&B to rock to gospel to glorious ballads. It took six years for the right DLO season to come along into which VIOLET fit. It was my own test of faith. VIOLET is my "field of dreams". I embraced the philosophy, "if you build it, they will come." I know now that it was supposed to be this timing, with this outstanding cast, in this diverse and talent-rich city. As a director, I feel blessed, grateful, and eager to share this.

Yes, I know you've probably never heard of VIOLET. I also know that this beautiful piece of theatre should not be missed and will sell out. (Not hype. Not propaganda. Sell out is the probability, not the possibility in this case.) I encourage you to get your tickets as soon as they become available. In fact, become a season member of DLO Musical Theatre today, so you can take advantage of the advance ticket sales. Join us for the journey! We're on our way.
