DIRECTOR'S NOTE

It was March 2008, and DLO was in rehearsal for *THE MUSIC MAN*, in which I played the role of Mrs. Paroo, and during which I was inspired to think I would love the creative challenge of directing a show myself.

I know the exact moment when this happened. It was when choreographer Jesse Pierce

brought together for the first time the three factions of the company number "76 Trombones". He had taught the children, the teen dancers and the adults in separate sessions. When he brought us all together for the first time and began running us through our paces, I was awestruck that his vision for the number was so all-encompassing that he could take three very different groups, performing three different ways, in different areas of the stage, teach them separately, and bring it all together in a whole that was exciting and amazingly cohesive.

Now, I knew then and know now that I am neither dancer nor choreographer, but I was enamored with the notion of bringing such vision to life. I'd directed variety-type cabaret-style shows. I'd assistant directed shows. But now, I wanted to direct. I wanted to exercise my intellect, my imagination, my experience and creativity. I was excited enough to start researching shows.

I formulated a list of qualifications to hone my research. The show had to have a manageable cast size. It had to have depth and substance, heart and realism. It had to have a story and a message. It also had to be a true actor's show, as acting is my passion. I had to love the music. I also wanted to find a show with which I was not very familiar, so my own vision would not be compromised by what others had done before me.

By May 2008, I'd developed a short list, and I read scripts and listened to music. The show with which I absolutely fell in love was *THE SPITFIRE GRILL*. It wasn't long after that before I submitted an official proposal to the DLO Board of Directors, and the day the proposal was accepted, I was overjoyed! Well, with everything except the fact that somehow I had to wait until 2010 to get it to stage. Who knew that almost two years could pass so quickly?

I am grateful to the people who joined me on this journey pretty early on. Karen Grove, music director, and Jessica Brackmann, choreographer, were enthusiastically on board by January 2009. A few weeks later, Susie and Mark Willard agreed to be my producers. Gary Lickfett was excited to design and execute the set, and his own enthusiasm continues to fuel to my fire. When Brian and Cookie Morris agreed to serve as co-stage managers/costumers, the production team was complete months before auditions were held. And we have new folks asking to be involved behind the scenes. Darcy Lack and Michelle Calvin have offered to help however we need them. I am very fortunate to have this kind of support.

We are just a few weeks into rehearsals. This cast is remarkable! Most names will be familiar to DLO audiences, and our newcomer is sure to make a lasting impression. All of them have embraced the spirit of *THE SPITFIRE GRILL* with the same passion it lit in me from the start. In next month's issue of *DLO e-Stage*, I will introduce them to you. For now, I will share that they are all gifted performers and a pleasure to direct. Audiences will see some of Danville's best actors pouring their hearts into their roles and songs, and it is a privilege to serve as their director.

Please join us for a delicious dinner, or our bountiful brunch, and let this cast move and delight you as they bring **THE SPITFIRE GRILL** to life!



Folks bring out the patio furniture and put the screens back in and breathe deeply and freshly. Seeds go in the waiting earth. The mowers come out. Birds build nests. Then the cycle repeats itself.

I feel fortunate to be a part of not only this cycle of Nature but other cycles as well: the history and evolution of Danville, the fifty-plus seasons of DLO, and, most meaningfully, the changing lives of family and friends with whom I have shared an abiding love of theatre. Despite what personal challenges we have endured offstage or what artistic hurdles we have faced onstage, we look with confidence and hope to the future and to what ever the next season has in store.
